What is SBIRT?

SBIRT (Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment) is a comprehensive, integrated, public health approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with substance use disorders, as well as those who are at risk of developing these disorders.

The initial screening can be accomplished in about 5 - 10 minutes and all Peach State Health Plan members that present specific behaviors are screened as part of the standard medical evaluation process. This screening tool addresses specific problematic behaviors that are or are not preconditioned to substance abuse or dependency. Also, the services occur in a PCP (Primary Care Physician) setting and includes a seamless transition between brief universal screening, brief intervention (BI) and/or brief treatment (BT), and referral to specialty SUD care.
