Make a Call for Your Health

You'll breathe easier when you work with your doctor.

o you (or your child) feel like you can't get enough air when you breathe? Does shortness of breath or a long-term cough stop you from being active?

These could be signs of an illness like asthma, bronchitis or COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease) or may be allergies. They can be treated or controlled.

If you're having any of these symptoms, talk to your doctor right away. Your doctor may do breathing tests or other tests to find the

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cause. This will help him or her choose a treatment that's right for you.

Call your doctor to set up a visit. You will have taken a big step for your health.

Know What You Can Expect

ou have many rights and responsibilities as a member. These rights cover your treatment, privacy and access to information.

Some of your rights are listed below. Look at the complete list in your member handbook. Or visit www.pshp.com.

Your rights include, but are not limited to:

- Receive all services that we must provide.
- → Be treated with respect, and with your dignity and privacy in mind.
- Know that your medical record information will be kept private.
- → Be able to ask for and get a copy of your medical record. Also, be able to ask for changes or corrections to the record.
- Be able to file an appeal, a grievance (complaint) or state hearing.

Some of your responsibilities include:

- Ask questions if you don't understand your rights.
- Keep your scheduled appointments.
- Bring your ID card with you to appointments.
- Always get in touch with your primary care physician (PCP) first if you have a medical need that is not an emergency.
- → Tell your PCP if you had care in an emergency room.

New Secure Member Portal

Keep an eye on your health! Peach State's secure member portal has a new look! The new look has many improvements that will help us serve you better. When you visit the new secure member portal, you will be able to:

- → View benefit information.
- → View recent medical claims, authorizations and your explanation of benefit.
- → Get healthy reminders.
- Print a temporary ID card and change your PCP.

The Planning for Healthy Babies (P4HB) program offers no-cost family planning services for eligible Georgia women. The program consists of three services:

- Family Planning (FP).
- Inter-Pregnancy Care (IPC).
- Resource Mother (RM).



- Is between the ages of 18 and 44.
- Meets the monthly family income limits for Medicaid.
- Does not receive Medicaid or any other insurance.

Also, keep follow-up visits with your child's doctor. The doctor will want to check how the medicine is working for your child.

Health Check is Important

Peach State cares about the health of your child. We want to make sure your child grows healthy and stays healthy. Health Check visits (or "well-child" visits) are important for all Medicaid children 0 to 21 years old and PeachCare for Kids children 0 to 19 years old. Children that are new to Peach State should see their doctor for a Health Check visit in 90 days. Children should get a blood lead level test at 12 months and 24 months.

Please call your child's primary care provider (PCP) today to schedule a Health Check visit. You should also call your PCP to:

- get shots and blood tests
- check any new health problems
 Please be sure to schedule an
 appointment as soon as possible if your child was referred to another doctor.

Children 6 months older should also see a dentist every six months. Call your child's dentist today to schedule a checkup.

Call our Member Services department at 1-800-704-1484 and ask to speak to a Health Check Coordinator if you need help to:

- find a PCP or dentist for your child
- make an appointment with your PCP for a health check or dental checkup
- arrange transportation to the appointment
- get information on Health Check

Case managers will:

- → Help you find doctors and other providers. This includes behavioral health providers.

- → Tell you about community resources.
