

Clinical Policy: CCI Bypass Modifiers

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Description

This policy describes adherence to the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI).

Policy/Criteria

- I. It is the policy of health plans affiliated with Centene Corporation® (Centene) and Envolve Vision, Inc.® (Envolve) to adhere to the CMS NCCI edits promoting national correct coding methodologies and reducing improper coding which may result in inappropriate payments of Medicare and Medicaid claims.

Background

Centene and Envolve apply both types of NCCI edits:

- NCCI procedure-to-procedure (PTP) edits that define pairs of Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS)/Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes that should not be reported together for a variety of reasons. The purpose of the PTP edits is to prevent improper payments when incorrect code combinations are reported.
- Medically Unlikely Edits (MUEs) define for each HCPCS/CPT code the maximum units of service (UOS) that a provider would report under most circumstances for a single beneficiary on a single date of service.

The AMA "CPT Manual" and CMS define modifiers that may be appended to HCPCS/CPT codes to provide additional information about the services rendered. Modifiers consist of two alphanumeric characters. Modifiers may be appended to HCPCS/CPT codes only if the clinical circumstances justify the use of the modifier. A modifier shall not be appended to a HCPCS/CPT code solely to bypass an NCCI PTP edit if the clinical circumstances do not justify its use. If the Medicare program imposes restrictions on the use of a modifier, the modifier may only be used to bypass an NCCI PTP edit if the Medicare restrictions are fulfilled. Modifiers that may be used under appropriate clinical circumstances to bypass an NCCI PTP edit include:

- Anatomic modifiers: E1-E4, FA, F1-F9, TA, T1-T9, LT, RT, LC, LD, RC, LM, RI
- Global surgery modifiers: 24, 25, 54, 55, 57, 58, 78, 79
- Other modifiers: 27, 59, 91, XE, XS, XP, XU

All services are subject to retrospective medical record review to ensure the services are appropriately documented and billed for separate payment.
