PHARMACY NOTICE: Opioid Safety Limits

Dear Prescriber.

Peach State Health Plan strives to find ways to improve our member's health and safety. Opioids when used properly, can help relieve pain. But when misused, they can cause addiction, overdose, and death. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Center for Medicaid and CHIP Services (CMCS), provided safety recommendations for opioid medicines. Peach State Health Plan has safety limits on the amount and days' supply on opioid medicines.

- Please refer to the Peach State Health Plan Preferred Drug List for opioid safety limits. **Prior authorization** may be required for opioid use*.
- Use non-opioid treatments first-line.
- Only prescribe opioids when alternative treatment is inadequate.
- Limit opioid dosages and duration.
- Educate on signs and symptoms of an overdose.
- Reassess need and possible taper of opioids.
- Use opioid screening/monitoring (i.e., Opioid Risk Tool)
- Always check The Georgia Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (GA PDMP) to monitor the prescribing of controlled substances.

- Collaborate with behavioral health specialist, pharmacists, and nurses.
- Narcan® Nasal Spray is available without a prior authorization for high-risk opioid use.
- Prior authorization submissions should include previous use of non-opioid medicines, assessment for continued opioid use and taper, and documentation of PDMP monitoring.
