Importance of Using CPT Category II Codes

Using CPT-CAT II Codes to help achieve better outcomes for your patients and your practice!

CPT-CAT II Codes are supplemental tracking codes used for performance measurement. It makes it easier to share data with the Health Plan quickly and efficiently. Billing CPT-CAT II codes on claims for certain medical services rendered and test results help to close HEDIS care gaps.

What are the benefits in using CPT-CAT II Codes?

- 1. Less medical record request: This will reduce medical records request from the Health Plan to confirm care or test results you have already completed and reduces disruption for you and your staff.
